

ORGANIZATION CONDUCT

Process Overview

COMPLAINT IS SUBMITTED

OSSA receives a report alleging that an organization may have violated university policy.

REPORT REVIEW

The report is reviewed to determine whether a Temporary Restraining Action (TRA) is needed to address potential risk or impact. If appropriate, the organization is given 24 hours to schedule a TRA meeting.

- **TRA Meeting** - A meeting is held with the Dean of Students or designee to discuss potential interim measures while the case proceeds.
- **No TRA Meeting** - If a TRA is not necessary, the case moves forward without interim restrictions.

ADMINISTRATIVE MEETING

A meeting between the organization and an OSSA designee to review the report, explain the process, and provide the organization an opportunity to respond to the allegations.

- **Deny Responsibility** - The organization does not accept responsibility.
- **Accept Responsibility** - The organization accepts responsibility for the alleged violation(s).

INVESTIGATION

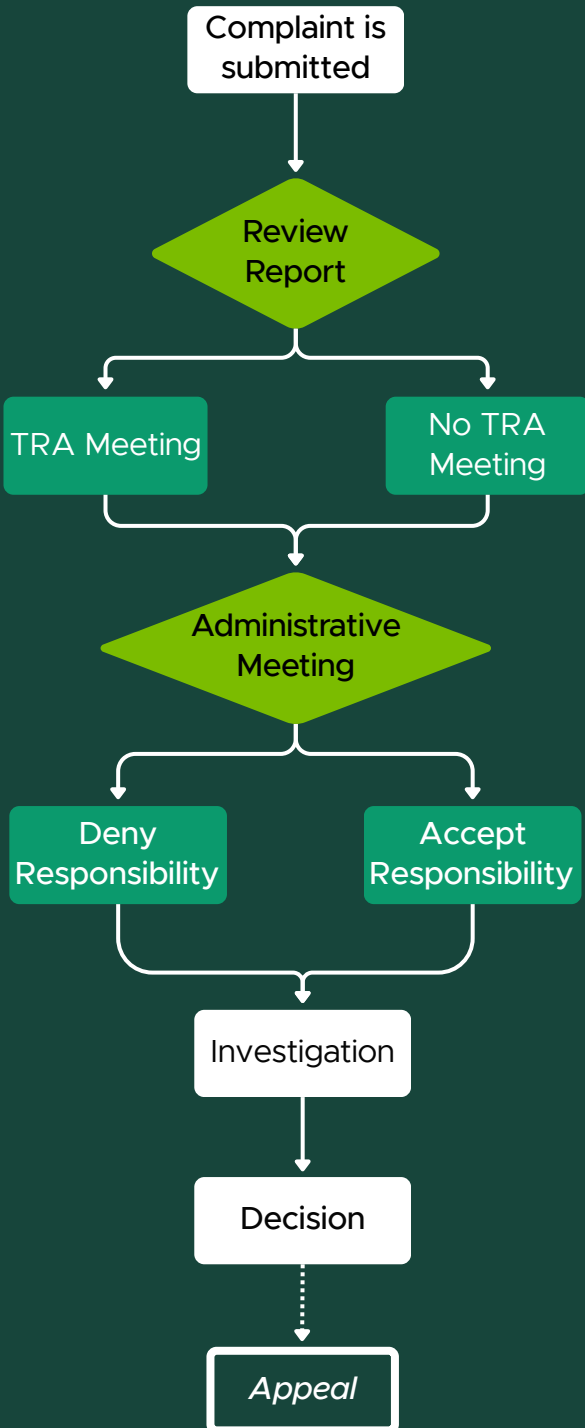
OSSA gathers additional information as needed to make a determination. This may include interviews with organization members, reviewing evidence, and collecting relevant details about the incident.

ISSUE DECISION

A determination is made regarding the allegation, and the organization is notified of the outcome and any assigned sanctions.

APPEAL (OPTIONAL)

The organization may submit an appeal based on specific grounds.
